RESOLUTION 2026-02

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SAN SABA TO WAIVE AN ORDINANCE DEFINING NOISE NUISANCES

WHEREAS, the City of San Saba desires to regulate and oversee any unreasonable loud, disturbing, unnecessary noise which causes material distress, discomfort or injury to persons of ordinary sensibilities in the immediate vicinity.

WHEREAS, the playing of any radio, phonograph or other musical instrument in such manner or with such volume, particularly during the hours between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons of ordinary sensibilities in any dwelling, hotel or other type of residence is prohibited.

WHEREAS, Marisol Chavirra, 601 W. Sunset, San Saba, Texas, has asked the City Council to waive Ordinance No. 1967-4 to allow music to be played at the Mill Pond Park Gazebo on January 24th, 2026 until 12:00 midnight.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of San Saba is hereby authorizing the playing of music from 10:00 to 12:00 midnight on January 24th, 2026, at the Mill Pond Park Gazebo.

He addressed the City Council and asked them to review the three letters and see the Statement Summary in front of the audit. Mr. Shahan explained and provided information as went through the audit. He gave the Audit a Clean Opinion for the 2025 Year Report. Mr. Shahan said the Internal Controls were functioning properly and continues to. Mr. Shahan also gave a 'Thank you' to Charlene, Sabrina, the City Manager, and the Girls at City Hall. After reviewing the audit, he said he is available if anyone has any questions about the audit and appreciates the City's transparency. Alderman Robert Whitten made a motion to approve the 2025 Financial Audit, seconded by Alderman Michael Nelson, and was unanimously approved by all.

The second item for discussion/action was to Discuss, consider, and take possible action regarding Resolution No. 2026-03, a Resolution of the City of San Saba, Texas in regard to a Finance Contract between the City of San Saba and Government Capital Corporation for the Purpose of Financing a "Vehicle and Upfitting" for the San Saba Police Department. Mayor Pro-Tem Marcus Amthor made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2026-03, seconded by Alderman Shawn Oliver and was approve on a 4 to 0 vote.

A RESOLUTION REGARDING A CONTRACT FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING A

WHEREAS, City of San Saba (the "Issuer") desires to enter into that certain Finance Contract by and between the Issuer and Government Capital Corporation ("GCC") for the purpose of financing a "Vehicle and Upfitting". The Issuer desires to designate this Finance Contract as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" of the Issuer for the purposes of Section 265 (b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY CITY OF SAN SABA:

Section 1. That the Issuer will enter into a Finance Contract with GCC for the purpose of financing a "Vehicle and Upfitting".

Section 2. That the Finance Contract by and between the City of San Saba and GCC is designated by the Issuer as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for the purposes of Section 265 (b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

Section 3. That the Issuer appoints the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, as the authorized signer of the Finance Contract by and between the City of San Saba and GCC as well as any other ancillary exhibit, certificate, or documentation needed for the Contract.

Section 4. The Issuer will use loan proceeds for reimbursement of expenditures related to the Property, within the meaning of Treasury Regulation § 1.150-2, as promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.




